November 26 Calgary, Alberta: Canada's biggest music awards – the 37th Annual JUNO Awards – will take over Calgary this coming spring. With everything from a face off between famous musicians and legendary hockey players to a Gala Awards Dinner and an intimate concert with Canada's finest songwriters, the weekend's events will culminate with The JUNO Awards broadcast, Sunday, April 6 on CTV. Tickets for the broadcast show go on sale February 9<sup>th</sup>, 2008 prices starting at \$69-\$199.

## Juno Awards Welcome Reception -

The Canadian music industry descends on Calgary and gathers at the Imperial Ballroom at the Hyatt Regency for an opening night reception on Friday, April 4<sup>th</sup>

### Juno Cup Celebrity Hockey Game-

Canadian musicians challenge former NHL Greats in a friendly fight to the finish! Now in its fifth year and always a fan favourite, the Juno Cup sponsored by The Keg Steakhouse faces off Friday, April 4th at The Stampede Corral. This event is fun to watch and in support of a very good cause. Tickets go on sale February 23<sup>rd</sup> and proceeds will go to MusiCan, the national music education charity of the Canadian Academy of Recording Arts and Sciences (CARAS).

## JunoFest-

Since CTV first took the JUNO Awards on the road to cities across the country in 2002, the show has been broadcast from six different provinces, including Newfoundland and Labrador (St. John's/2002), Ontario (Ottawa/2003), Alberta (Edmonton/2004), Manitoba (Winnipeg/2005), Nova Scotia (Halifax/2006) and Saskatchewan (Saskatoon/2007). CTV's broadcast of *The JUNO Awards* is now Canada's most-watched awards program, reaching millions of Canadian viewers. Previous hosts include Nelly Furtado (2007), Pamela Anderson (2006), Brent Butt (2005), Alanis Morissette (2004), Shania Twain (2003) and Barenaked Ladies (2002).

The 2008 JUNO Awards is produced by Insight Productions in association with CTV and the Canadian Academy of Recording Arts and Sciences (CARAS).
